- 3. What was Hurricane Matthew rated on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale when it reaches the island nation of Haiti? <u>It was a category 4 hurricane, with sustained winds of 145 mph.</u>
- 4. What was the death toll on Haiti from Hurricane Matthew? close to 900
- 5. What U.S. naval ship was deployed to Haiti to assist in relief efforts? the U.S.S. Mesa Verde
- 6. When did Hurricane Matthew make landfall in the Bahamas? on the evening of October 6<sup>th</sup>
- 7. According to the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale, what type of damage may be caused by a category 4 hurricane? **extreme damage**
- 8. With the approach of Hurricane Matthew toward the United States, who urged residents of coastal states in the southeast part of the United States to heed requests of emergency personnel to evacuate low-lying areas? <a href="Personnel Barack Obama">President Barack Obama</a>

- 16. Why do hurricanes usually form near the equator? Hurricanes need warm waters of at least 80° F in order to form. Warm waters are found near the equator.
- 17. What is another name for a hurricane? tropical cyclone
- 18. What is the difference between a hurricane and a typhoon? Both are tropical cyclones, but a hurricane forms in the North Atlantic and Northeast Pacific Oceans and typhoons form over the Northwest Pacific Ocean.
- 19. In what direction do tropical cyclones rotate south of the equator? clockwise
- 20. In what direction do tropical cyclones rotate north of the equator? counter clockwise
- 21. The center of a hurricane is called the eye.
- 22. What part of a hurricane has the heaviest rainfall and highest wind speed? the eyewall
- 23. What is storm surge? a rise in sea levels caused by atmospheric pressure changes and winds created by a storm

- 6. Who is the defense minister of Japan? **Tomomi Inada**

- 9. What is the range of a Musadan missile? approximately 2,180 miles




